An Adaptable Trade: The Jewellery Quarter at War

Between the outbreak of the First and the Second World Wars, Birmingham's jewellery industry was seen, with an estimated 1,500,000 people employed in manufacturing jewellery and supplying the trade. But as war broke out, demand for everyday watches, silverware, and gold jewellery made no headway, creating much of the former devastation. This exhibition explores how the industry adapted to survive war-time. It features hand-picked, and the most significant, items. Looking to identify the prominent Jewellery Quarter firms, and illustrated with items loaned from family collections, it reveals the extraordinary survival made by a generation of Birmingham people.

Revealed: Treasures from the Last Collection

Each Jewellery history will be thoroughly represented in an exhibition. It will include about 400 works with a focus on the 19th century. The exhibition is organized by the Parisian jewellers. An international jury will select the participants based on applications from the artists. The exhibition will feature the museum and most relevant of the jewelry industry presented in a special exhibition. It is a special exhibition program featuring jewelry as a genre in the galleries and different rooms of the Louvre during the period of the exhibition.
